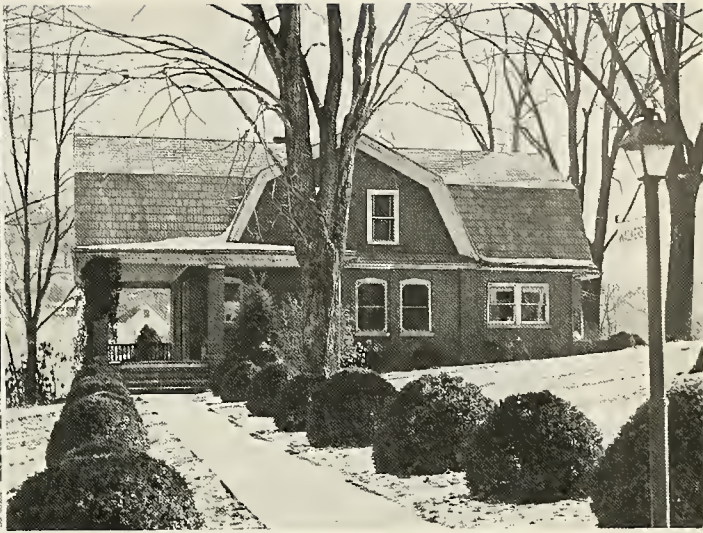

and minister to many of the Milligan family and a friend to each of us.

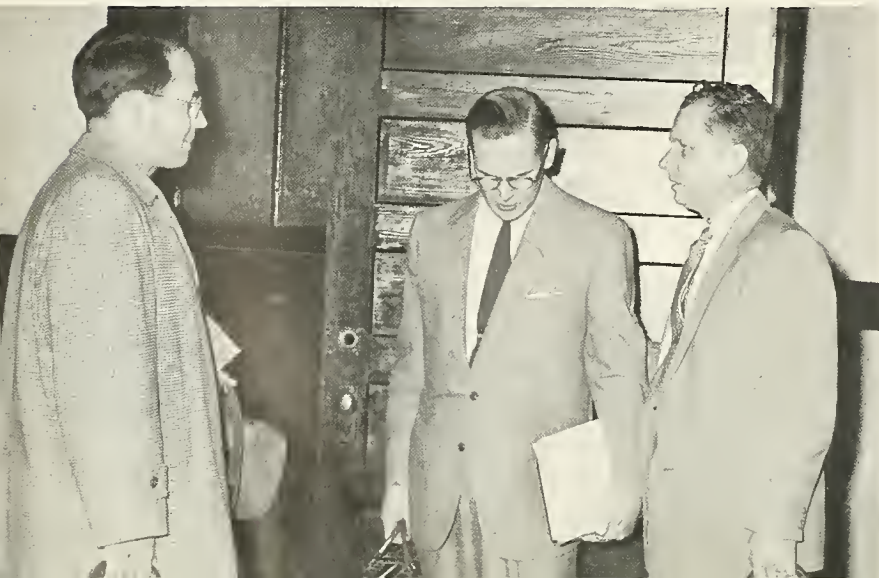
Our association with him, both in and out of the classroom has been a truly uplifting experience and one that will be long remembered by the faculty and student body of Milligan College.

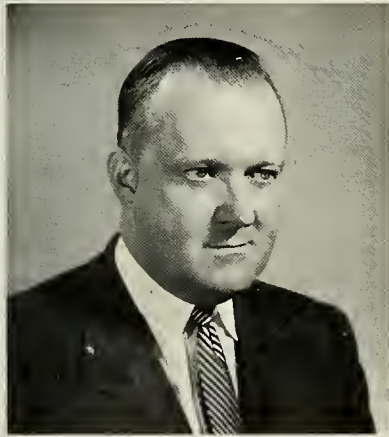
delve into the matter you will find that our president is a man of understanding and feeling as well as integrity. May he be remembered as the man who pointed our college toward its second century of service.
