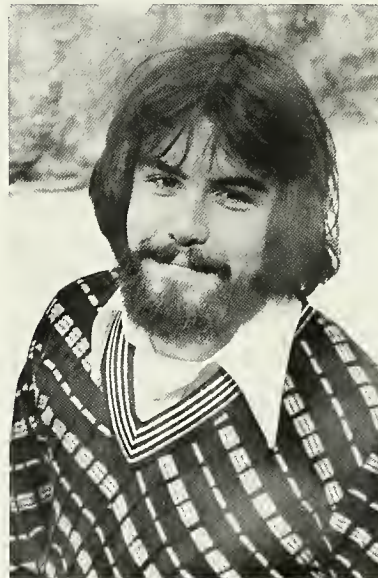
Rosemary C. Birkel

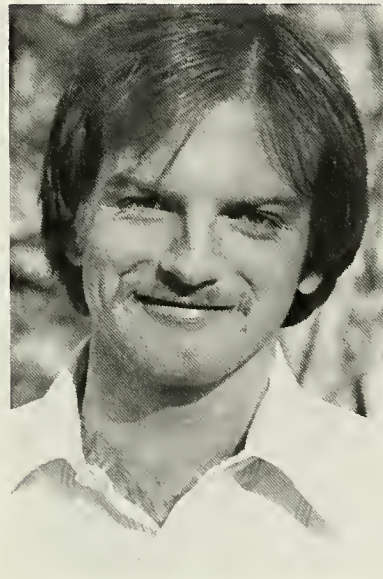
Deborah Fralish

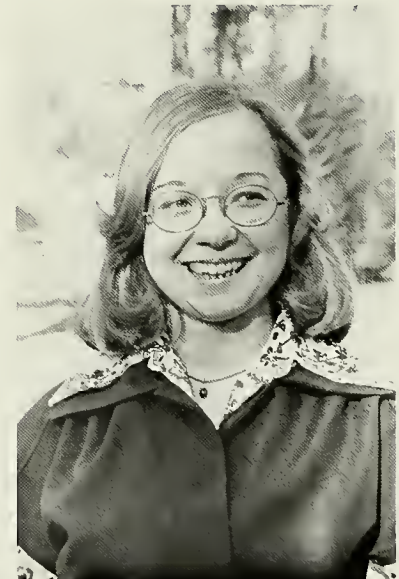
David Joe Hatter

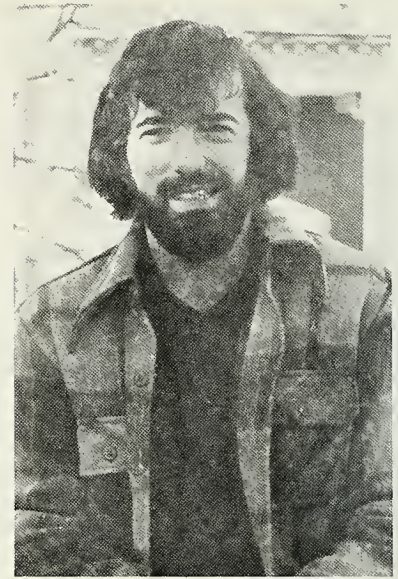
John Doran Ray, Jr.

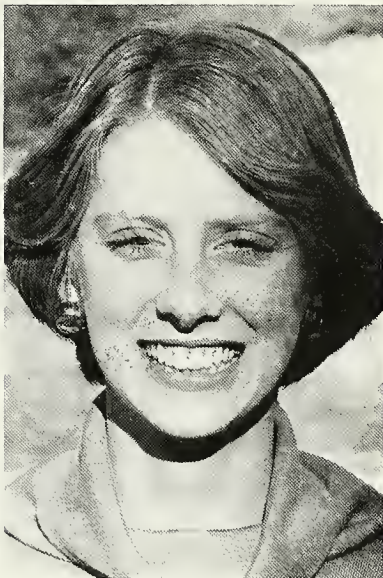
Becky Reeves

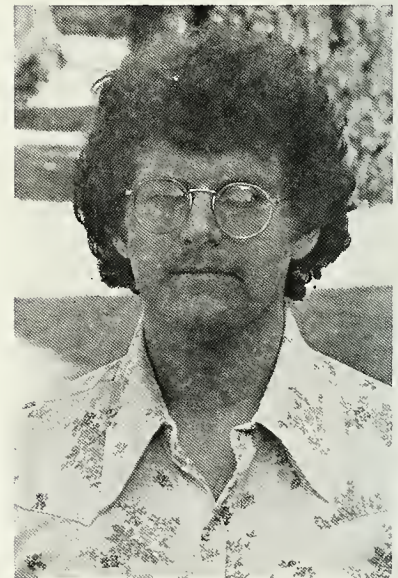
Robin Thomas

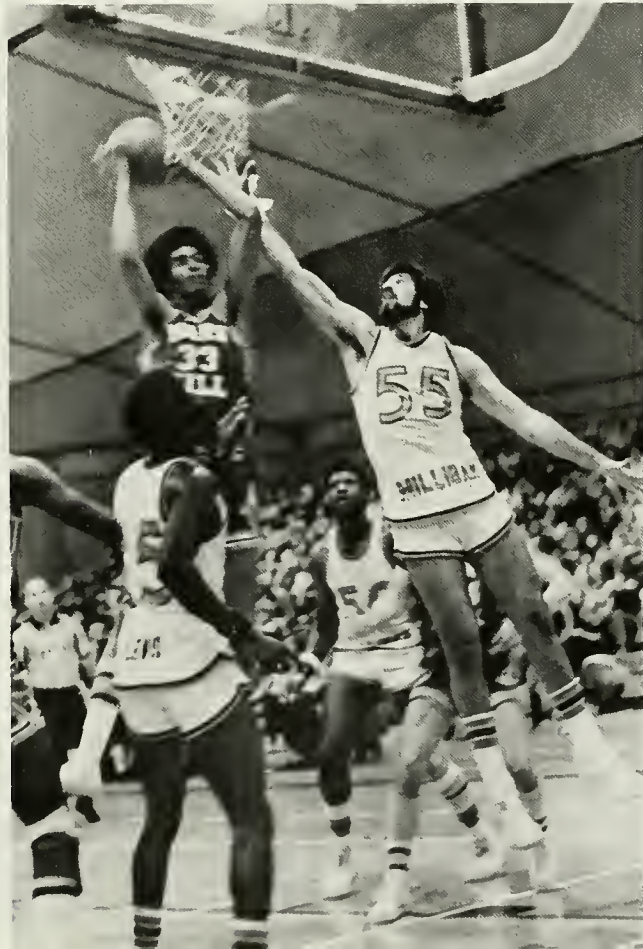
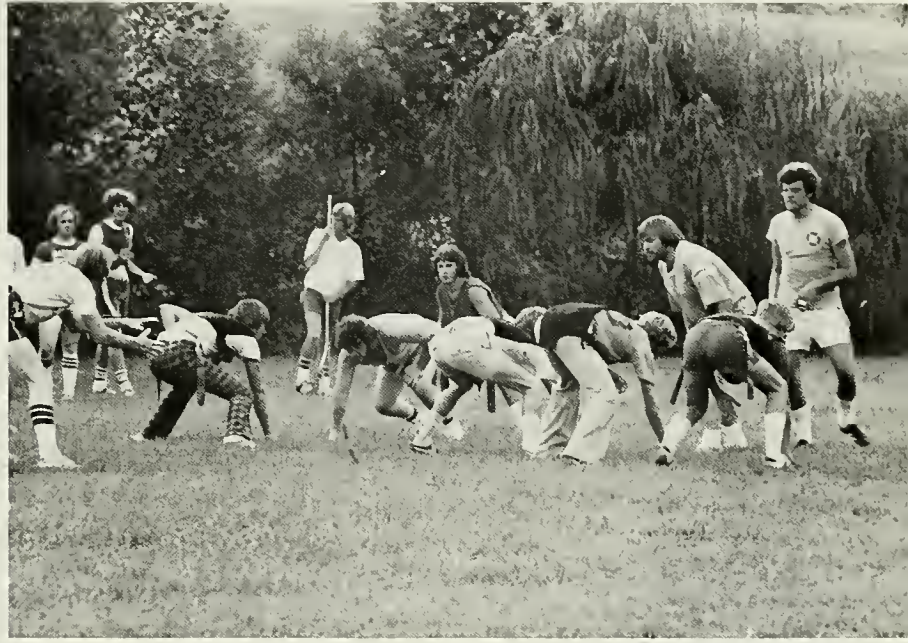


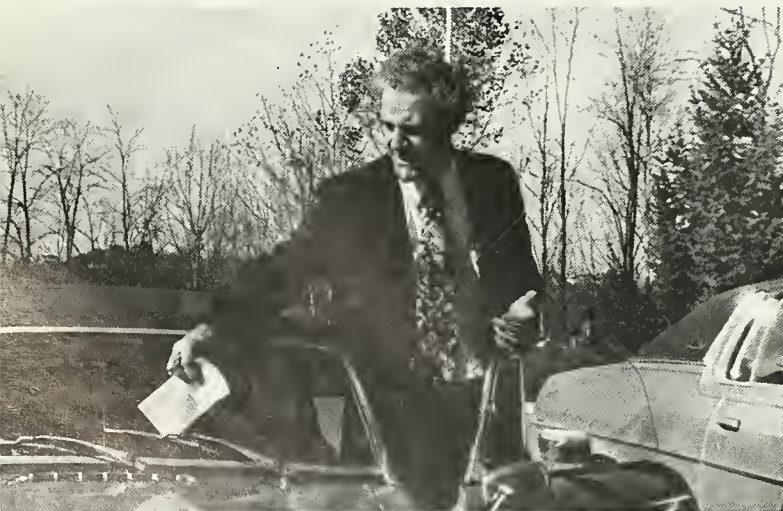
Intramurals
