DEDICATION

Professor Eugene Patton Price, Sr. came to Milligan in September of 1949. Since joining the faculty, he has become one of nine full professors, co-chairman of the Area of Professional Learning and Director of Placement (a service he began in 1960).

Mr. Price hails from Erwin - 'The Garden' - where he began his education at Elm Street Elementary and Unicoi County High School. His college career was interrupted by World War II. After his service as a sergeant in the United States Air Force he returned to Duke University to complete his B.A. and Master's degrees.

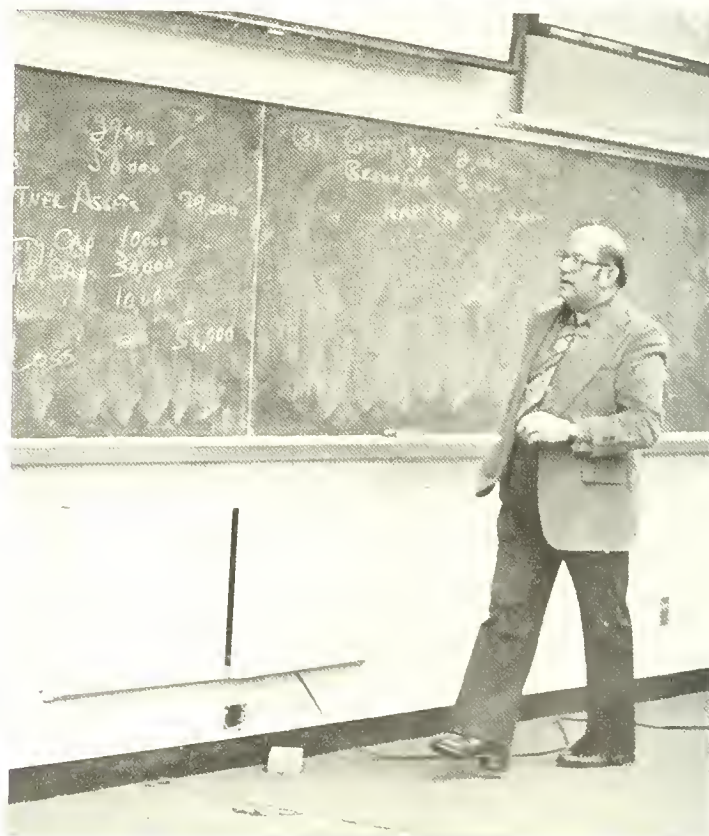
Mr. Price presently teaches courses in business administration and economics at Milligan, teaches banking courses at ETSU, serves as co-sponsor for Phi Beta Lambda, secretary of the Academic Committee, member of the Insurance and Bulletin Committees and marshall for the faculty. 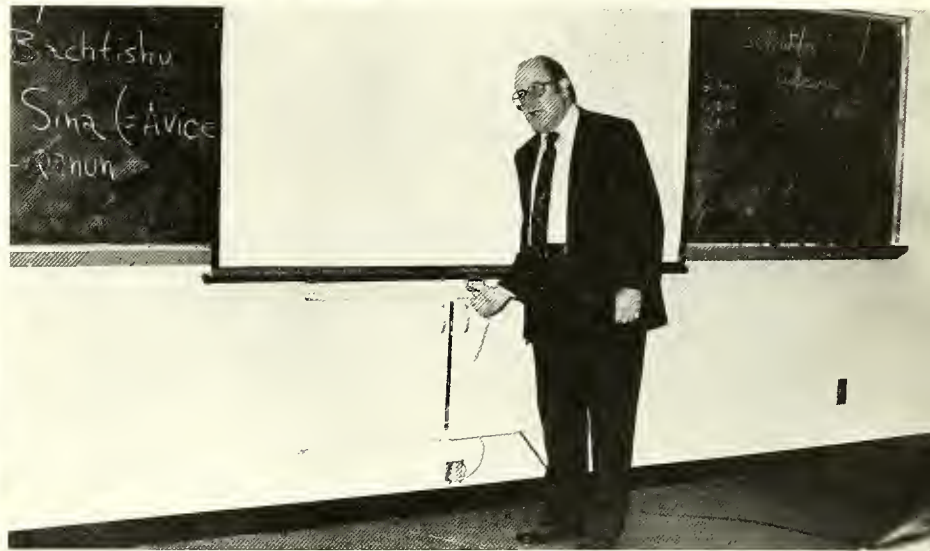
Mr. Price is a member of the First Christian Church of Erwin, where he is a teacher for a men's Bible class, Bible School Superintendent and member of the church choir.

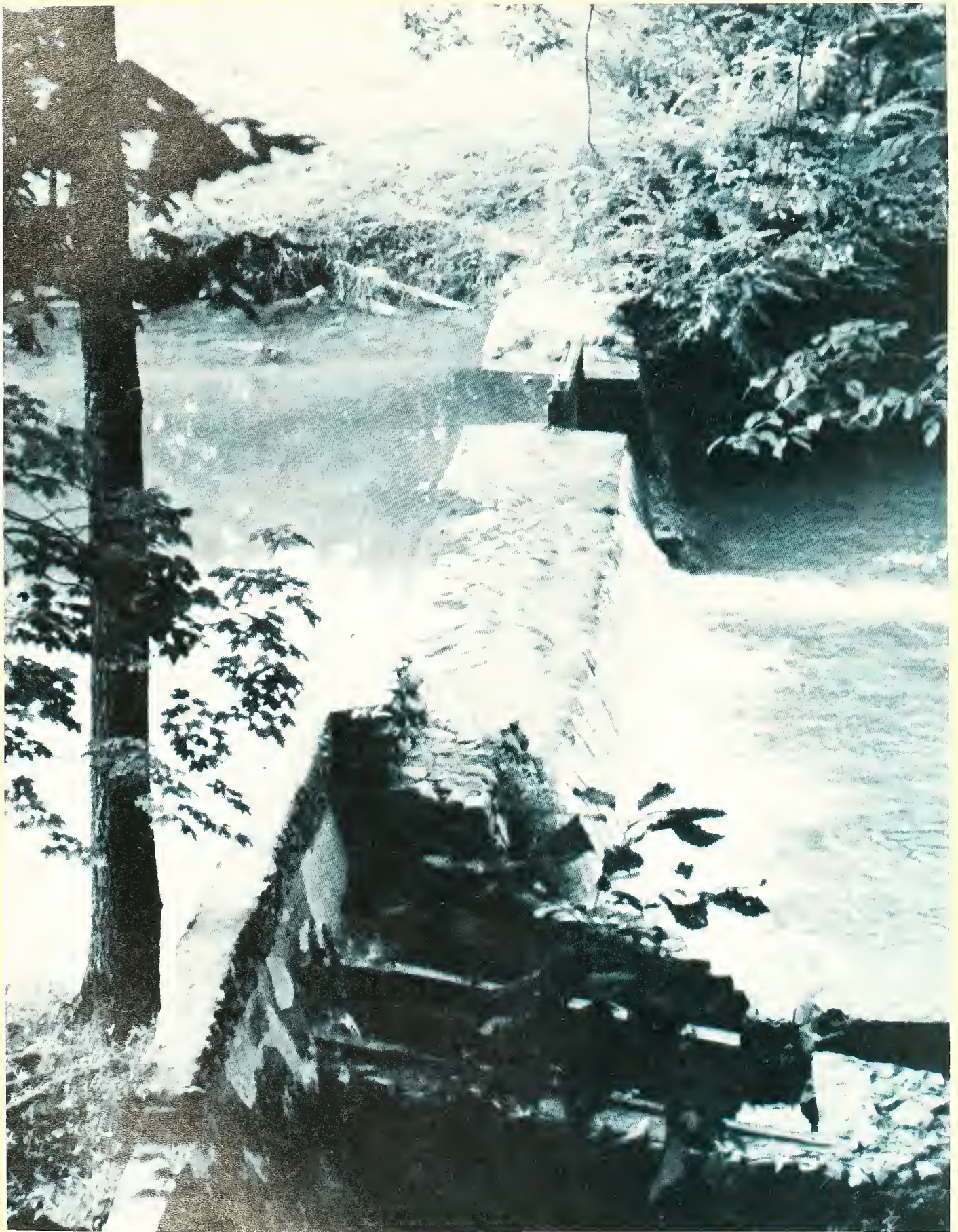

Class of '81

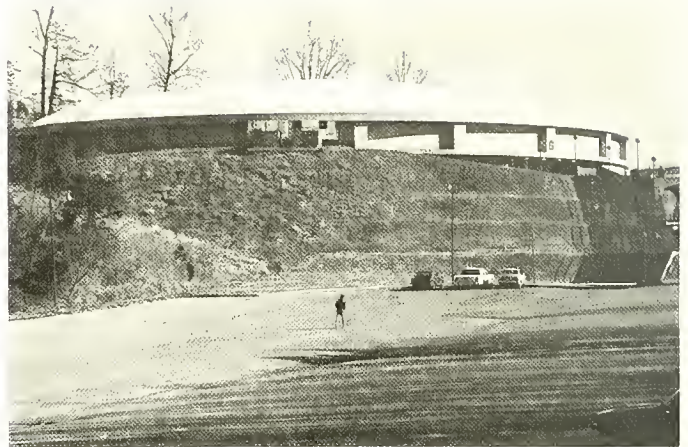
