


Why This Topic?

- Prevalence of violence against women of color
 - o Domestic, racialized, institutional
- Christianity perpetuates violence
- Both historic and current



About this Topic

- Approx. 35 percent of women suffer violence, physical or sexual, during their lifetime ("Facts and Figures")
- American Indian and Black women: 10% and 7% more likely to experience intimate partner violence than white women (Osborne)
- The church must rectify its wrongs

The Church, Women, and Violence

- Theological Distortions
 - Male Authority
 - Eve's Sin
 - Ephesians "Household Code"
- ∘ Male Authority → Male Violence

The Church, Women, and Violence

- Other Theological Interpretations:
 - "Suffering Servant" Motif
 - Disapproval of Divorce
- ∘ Distortions → Vulnerability to Abuse

The Church, Race, and Violence


- Church's Racial Distortions:
 - Silence in the Church
 - Segregation within the Church
- ∘ Intersectional Distortions → Violence against Women of Color

America's History of Racism

- Today's violence reflects racial injustice throughout history
- Early Abuses by Christians
- Physical vs. Spiritual Freedom
- Religion as a Vessel of Oppression

- Frederick Douglass and Religion as a Weapon

America's Continual Injustice

- o Improvements for people of color, yet continual social injustice
- Civil War
- Battles within Churches
- Frederick Douglass and Christianity

America's Continual Injustice

- White supremacy following Civil War
 - Use of Christian motifs for violent purposes
- The church's subtle contribution to racism
 - Segregation and move to suburbs

Historical Violence against Women

- U.S. history demonstrates both racial and gendered violence
- Male violence + race = "justified violence"
- o Christianity's perpetuation of racial, gendered violence
- Women of Color and sexualized violence

Injustice and Dehumanization

- ∘ Racial and sexual injustice → dehumanization
- Douglass's Examples
 - Dehumanization is justified with Bible
 - Christianity of Bible vs. South

Modern Violence against Women

- Patriarchal, racist distortions of the gospel contribute to violence
- "54% of women of color are survivors of intimate partner violence" (Osborne)
- Fear of seeking help
- The church's silence



Institutional Violence

- Police brutality against women of color
- From 2013-2016, "more than 70 Black women and girls have been murdered due to state violence (Khaleeli, 2016)" (Ashley Smith 264)
- The church's support of police
- Women of color as "other"

Reforming Injustice: Theology

- Theology, the church, and society must be reformed
- Theological Reform:
 - Adam's Complicity
 - Equality within "Household Code"

Reforming Injustice: Church and Society

- Honesty about the past and mistakes
 - Repentance
- Programs tailored for women of color
- Church and society must work together

Reforming Injustice: Church

- Tisby's approach to reconciliation and reform in the church:
 - ARC Method: awareness, relationships, commitment (194)
 - Church reparations
- Reform can be gracious

Moving Forward

- The church must educate and discuss
- Act as children of God toward women of color
- Cry out against injustice, violence, oppression
- Be the world's peacemakers
