MY PERSONAL EXPERIENCE TO THE YOUNG PEOPLE EVERYWHERE, GREETINGS:

Within the past seventy three years, I have learned, that every "white man" is not my enemy. And every "colored man" is not my friend. Remember, Christ Jesus was born of the "Jews". And every "Jew" was not His friend. And every "Gentile" was not His enemy. John, chapter one, verse eleven tells us that; "He came unto his own,

and his own received him not. Please keep in mind that, I am not an "Old Uncle Tom". I am a Christian and a member of the Church of Christ; and I am not ashamed of it.

HOW IS THIS FOR OPEN-MEMBERSHIP?

A United Christian Missionary Society church, with a Baptist preacher for a pastor, worshipping in a Methodist church? We have seen strange things today. Luke 5:26.

I AM NOT A LAWYER

But I have been told that "common law marriage" is illegal in some states. If a woman is good enough for a man to live with like husband and wife; then she is good enough for him to marry. And they won't be living in adultery. What I am trying to say is this. If a congregation of one faith, have a pastor of another faith is that common law living? Is that living in Christian adultery? Or we would preach Matthew 12:3-4. "But he said unto them, Have ye not read what David did, when he was an hungered, and they that were with him; How he entered into the house of God, and did eat the shewbread, which was not lawful for him to eat."

Those were the good old days. Large fresh eggs ten cents a dozen.

Dean I. H. (I Have) Moore, of the College Scriptures, will celebrate his 90th birthday May 12, 1970. He said when he was a boy "eggs were so cheap the hens would not 'cackle' when they laid eggs." He is much older than I am.

Fifty years later, I have discovered that fifty dollars a year, was good salary, for the kind of preaching I was doing then.

I have not missed the Lord's Supper on the Lord's Day in fifty years. When I was in the hospital the church brought me the Lord's Supper, every Lord's Day. In my travel around the country I would take my communion set with me, and serve myself if I did not find the church of the New Testament.

I was born in America. Belong to the Church of Christ. Read the New Testament daily. For one dollar a year I can read every issue of the Christian Informer. That is what I call good luck. Don't you?

THE THIRD TRAGEDY

The third tragedy happened to the historical and beautiful Mt. Olivet Christian Church building. This building was formerly known as The Christian Temple of Baltimore. The late Dr. Peter Ainslie was pastor.

This church building was destroyed by fire, Lord's Day, May 3, 1970.

THE FIRST TRAGEDY

The tragedy happened when the congregation let Dr. C. L. Whitfield retire as pastor. Under Dr. Whitfield's leadership, the church building was bought and paid for; the price was eighty five thousand dollars. Dr. Whitfield made Mt. Olivet one of the leading churches of the Brotherhood.

THE SECOND TRAGEDY

The second tragedy happened when Pastor Gee resigned after a short term as pastor. Instead of calling Dr. Whitfield out of retirement and back to the pulpit as pastor; or some other qualified Christian preacher, like Elder George Jones. What do you think was done? Somebody or some open membership group, put in a Baptist preacher as pastor.

The same thing was done at the Hegerstown church. When the pastor resigned; somebody or some open membership group put a Methodist preacher in as pastor. He is not there now. About forty seven years ago I pastored Mt. Olivet and also the church at Hegerstown later on. To put a denominational preacher in a church I have pastored, is like putting a wild "BULL" in a china closet with your precious dishes.

Read second Corinthians six chapter verses 13-14-15-16-17-18. Be ye not unequally yoked together. What concord hath Christ with Belial? What agreement hath the temple of God with idols? for ye are the temple of the living God. Wherefore come ye out from among them, and be ye separate, and I will receive you, And will be a Father unto you, and ye shall be my sons, and daughters, saith the Lord Almighty."

My Preacher Friend

I asked a retired preacher friend of mine how the Lord's church was progressing in the congregation where he is supply preacher. He said, "There are great opportunities for the Lord's church there, but the people will not gather together to worship the Lord."

"O that I had in the wilderness a lodging place of wayfaring men; that I might leave my people and go from them!" (Jeremiah 9:2)

How often have these words of Jeremiah resounded through the mind of my preacher friend? Why, we ask, would this preacher spend thirtynine consecutive years in the heart of one of America's largest cities? Why does he continue to preach in such sinful, tempestuous situations? When the tempest was raging, it would have been easy to just "fly away".

In attempting to answer these questions it is first evident my friend is a man of obedience. He has a close relationship with Paul the apostle, who wrote, "I am debtor both to Greeks and to Barbarians, both to the wise and to the foolish. So, as much as in me is, I am ready to preach the gospel to you also that are in Rome." (Romans 1:14-15)

Secondly, my friend has great faith. His faith first came to him by hearing the preached Word. (Romans 10:17). He feels his own responsibility to all men for what he heard and knows. Then he shows he feels directly responsible to God for proclaiming his faith in its fulness.

Faith comes by hearing. This means personal evangelism, face to face teaching and preaching, and individual conversions. My friend fully realizes this is God's most effective way of saving souls, especially in large cities. My friend is sure of his own relationship to God, so with the promise that his own soul shall see God, he had a work to do and for fifty years he has worked.

He knows "... that faith without works is dead." (James 2:20).

My friend never hides behind the hedges concerning BIBLICAL truth. Never is he accommodating, compromising divine doctrine, to win friends or financial support. Like Paul, he was definite from the beginning, always letting it be known where he stands. He stands on the ROCK.

My friend's Jerusalem has continually felt the impact of the Good News he preaches. He has extended Christ's message to "regions beyond," (2 Cor. 10:16) traveling all over the United States.

Again, the answer to "why" can be found in the real convert that he is. He escaped from the servitude of self and sin through Jesus Christ. My friend is sure the blood of God's Son covered his sin. The message he has for others he is absolutely sure of.

My friend has preached to thousands. Many have not received his message, but he is never doubtful of his message.

His message is a living message. Not in a fanciful way, but literally we can say my friend lives with Christ.

His life in Christ has been full of divine guidance and activity. The Lord has stood by him and strengthened him. (2 Tim. 4:17). The Lord told Jeremiah, "be not afraid because of them; for I am with thee to deliver thee." (Jeremiah 1:8)

Thank you so much for your wonderful paper, "The Christian Informer". I really like the part of "What We Believe and Preach" where you say,

NO COLOR, BUT THE PURE IN HEART".

I quoted from that Sunday morning in my sermon to our people in South Carolina. I am going to memorize it and use it wherever I go. It is a message much needed in this day.

I told brother Esaie Dieudonne of the good news that Emmanuel Christian Church was going to build an Emmanuel Christian Church in Haiti. They are so happy for the good news.

Our month of Evangelism in Haiti, February resulted in 231 baptisms into Christ. 40 more confessions of faith in Christ were made, but they were not yet baptized at the time of our departure. This is a total of 271 decisions for Christ for the month.

Leland Tyrrell was in Haiti for a week in February as part of our evangelistic team. Remi Duhon worked with a non-instrumental Church of Christ and as a result of the fellowship the preacher saw that he could no longer make an instrument a test of fellowship. His church is self-supporting. They also sponsor a radio broadcast. Radio time can be purchased for \$15 a broadcast. I would like to have a broadcast there.

For life is given us to mold a way


Of happiness for others we have known—

How to Keep Your Job

ANY WORKERS are dismissed from their jobs who do not learn the real reason. Employers are human, and rarely have the heart to tell the dismissed person the real reason for dismissal.

There are a dozen reasons why an employer feels compelled to dismiss a worker, which he will not reveal to the worker.

Laziness. Profit-minded employers do not fire employes whose production returns them a profit on their investment. "He profits most who serves best" applies to the employe as surely as it does to the employer.

Disloyalty. The disloyal employe is like the rotten apple in the barrel, spoiling all those around him. The wise employe refuses to listen to the worker who bites the hand that's feeding him.

Intemperance. The intemperate worker is unreliable. In the business world, reliability is "the priceless ingredient," the cornerstone of progress as well as lasting success.

Poor personality. Some people are born with charm; others must and can acquire it. Without friendliness, tactfulness, magnanimity, a sense of generous cooperation, one is likely to find himself out on a limb.

Poor health. Frequent absenteeism works narcship on fellow-workers as much as it does on the employer. Poor health becomes intolerable.

Emotional instability. The person who is overly sensitive, who blows up under every provacative incident or pressure, who fancies himself slighted and imagines unintended hurts, is an undependable employe who may be temporarily tolerated as a necessary evil, but eventually riges for a fall.

Cooperation. Affairs in business do not always go true to Hoyle. An employe who does not cooperate under unusual circumstances by declining to deviate from routine, may find that the business can get along without him.

Dishonesty. Dishonesty may take many other forms besides direct misappropriation of funds. A falsifier, a don't-care worker, a laggard when the boss isn't looking, is essentially dishonest. So is a malicious gossip and waster of time—of other's as well as his own.

Talkativeness. A desirable employe, like a good actor, knows how to listen to, as well as to deliver a speech. Many an employe has talked himself out of a job, not realizing it. Silence at the right time is golden.

Unprogressiveness. Inflexibility of mind and inability to change with conditions is a hindrance.
