FLOWERS TO THE LIVING

Flowers to Doctor R. Tibbs Maxey, Founder and President Emeritus of the College of the Scriptures, Louisville, Kentucky. And Founder of the WIDE WORLD RALLY. While he can see and smell the flowers. As stated in 2 Corinthians, 5: 14. The love of Christ constrained him to start this college.

I know what I am talking about, because he came to Baltimore to talk with me about starting this college, when I was president of the National Christian Missionary Convention. He was recommended to me by Dr. C. W. Arnold, Minister of the Ninety-Second Street Church of Christ, Los Angeles, Calif., then of Ohio. Confess your faults one to another. James 5:16.

First. Let me tell you how Brother Maxey helped me. I did not need his money, nor his friendship. I was born in North Carolina, the grandson of a slave. I lived with my uncle and aunt, who were born in slavery. They told and taught me about the evils of slavery.

Because of jim-crowism, segregation and discrimination, I learned racial prejudice at an early age and in a big way. I was taught from my youth up, not to have any thing to do with a "White Man" if he was poor and from the South.

I think Brother Arnold must have told Brother Maxey about my attitude toward some people, and about some parts of the Country. I am sure Brother Arnold told Brother Maxey that I was so prejudiced toward some people, that I would not eat Southern fried chicken; it had to be named Northern, Eastern or Western fried. Now since I am a full grown Christian, I enjoy eating Southern fried chicken. "It is finger licking good."

Remember, when Brother Maxey came to see me in Baltimore about 1943. He did not look rich and prosperous as he does now.

More than ten years before I ever heard of Brother Maxey, because of my love for the Church of Christ and its doctrine as found in the New Testament. I was forced to fall out and cussout, an outstanding preacher of the "Open-Membership Movement." That episode added fuel to my racial prejudice, because I did not have as much religion then as I have now.

Because of segregation and discrimination at certain International and World Conventions, long time ago, I was hurt and made a vow that I would never attend another open membership convention. That episode added fuel to my racial prejudice.

How did Dr. Maxey help me? When he came to Baltimore, I had arranged for him to stay at a down town hotel at my expense. Where I could not go in those days except to carry his suitcase. He asked me to let him stay at my house. And he became the first man of his race to eat at my table and to sleep in my bed, and to preach in my pulpit. I can say of him what Christ said about Nathanael in John 1:47.

Behold an Israelite indeed, in whom is no guile. Sometime later he invited me to Louisville, Ky. His home was the first home of his race I ever stayed. His bed was the first bed of his race I ever slept in. His table was the first table of his race I ever ate. His children were the first children of his race to tell me good-night at bed time.

You have heard me say down through the years that Tibbs Maxey is so close to me, until when he catch cold, I sneeze.

I know what he has suffered to make the College of the Scriptures what it is today. By some of his people he has been called a "nigger lover." By some of my people he has been called "poor white trash." I know what I am talking about.

Brother Maxey helped me to get rid of racial

hatred. The first time I ever sleep in a room with a man of another race was in his home. The first time I ever sleep in a bed with a man of another race was in the home of Dr. E. Steve Lawhom, now President of the College.

SUNSET PARK CHURCH OF CHRIST Savannah, Georgia Charles E. Clay. Minister

The Sunset Park Church of Christ was started August 3, 1969 as a congregation where "whosoever will—may come" regardless of race or color. We feel this is in line with the teachings of the scriptures, that the Church was bought with the blood of Christ for all mankind and not just a select group. We are an independent, self-governing, self-sustaining body of Christians. Elders and deacons, elected by the congregation, make up the official board which conducts the normal business for the congregation. Matters of major importance are referred to the congregation and the congregational decision is final.

The Sunset Park Church of Christ is a nondenominational body of Christians striving not to reform the church but rather to restore it to its original pattern as set forth in the New Testament. We are not part of a reformation movement but rather a movement interested in restoring the Church to its original concept. As such, we are not a denomination, for we do not have a denominational or "manmade" creed or book of doctrine. Our name, for members is Christians; for congregations, Churches of Christ or Christian Churches. Not the only Christians, but Christians only. No creed but Christ, no book but the Bible. For our book of Doctrine or list of beliefs, we have simply the Word of God. As for ordinances we find in the Word of God only two and those are baptism by immersion and the weekly observance of the Lord's Supper. We believe that all human creeds and "Confessions of Faith" should be abolished. Paul says in Galatians 1:8, "But though we, or an angel from heaven preach any other gospel unto you than that which we have preached unto you, let him be accursed." We maintain that the Bible alone is sufficient for our rule of faith and practice. We go to the Bible for our authority in Church government, as well as to learn the plan of salvation. Whatever the Bible commands us to do, those things we do, what the Bible forbids, from those we refrain; where the Bible is silent, there is freedom of opinion. Thru the study of the New Testament a definite plan has been given as to how one may become a Christian. While the space will not allow us to go into much detail here, we will give you enough references for you to go to the scriptures and prove to your own satisfaction as to whether this plan is correct and complete. For study purposes use you hand and let each finger and thumb represent a definite step in the plan of salvation.

FAITH OR BELIEF is represented by your little finger. You must believe that Jesus is the

Christ, the son of the Living God. How does one get faith? "Faith cometh by hearing and hearing by the Word of God," Romans 10:17 Read John 3:16, Hebrews 11:1, Hebrews 11:6, Hebrews 12:2.

REPENTANCE is represented by your ring finger. Repentance is turning from sin and involves both a sorrow for sin and a true desire to live nearer to Christ. Read Acts 17:30-31, Acts 2:38. II Peter 3:9.

CONFESSION is represented by your middle finger. Confession is simply a public witnessing to the fact that you do believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of the Living God. Read Matthew 10:32-33, Romans 10:9-10, Matthew 16:13-19, Acts 8:37.

BAPTISM is represented by your forefinger. Baptism is not just a religious ceremony, but is the act of saving faith whereby the believing, repentant, confessing sinner comes into contact with the blood of Christ. Read Acts 2:38, Romans 6:3-5, I Peter 3:20-21, Galatians 3:27, Mark 16:

CHRISTIAN LIVING is represented by your thumb. If your real hand had no thumb for all purposes it would be useless. The same applies to our "Christian hand." The first four fingers merely get you into Christ and without Chrisian living the first four steps are in vain. Read II Peter 2:20-22, II Peter 1:5-9, Acts 2:42, James 2:14-26.

WHAT GREAT MEN SAY ABOUT BAPTISM

- 1. John Calvin-Presbyterian. The word "baptize" signifies to immerse. It is certain that immersion was the practice of the primitive church.
- 2. Martin Luther-Lutheran. Baptism is a Greek word, and may be translated, immerse. I would have those who are to be baptized to be altogether
- 3. John Wesley-Methodist. Buried with him by baptism-alluding to the ancient manner of baptizing by immersion.
- 4. Wall—Episcopalian. Immersion was in all probability the way in which our blessed Savior, and for certain the way by which the ancient

Christians received their baptism.

- 5. Brenner—Catholic. For thirteen hundred years was baptism an immersion of the person under water.
- 6. Macknight—Presbyterian. In baptism the baptized person is buried under the water. Christ submitted to be baptized: that is, to be buried under
- 7. Whitfield—Methodist. It is certain that the word of our text, Romans 6:4, alludes to the manner of baptism by immersion.

The Open-Membership Movement was started a few years ago by self-appointed preachers who were "disobedient unto the heavenly vision," and The New Testament doctrine.

The Open Membership Movement is like all denominational movements. Romans 10:2-3:

- 2. For I bear them record that they have a zeal of God, but not according to knowledge.
- 3. For they being ignorant of God's righteousness, and going about to establish their own righteousness, have not submitted themselves unto the righteousness of God.
- 4. For Christ is the end of the law for righteousness to every one that believeth.

Matthew 15:8-15:

- 8. This people draweth nigh unto me with their mouth, and honoureth me with their lips; but their heart is far from me.
- 9. But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men.
- 10. And he called the multitude, and said unto them, Hear, and understand:
- 11. Not that which goeth into the mouth defileth a man; but that which cometh out of the mouth, this defileth a man.
- 12. Then came his disciples, and said unto him, Knowest thou that the Pharisees were offended, after they heard this saying?
- 13. But he answered and said, Every plant, which my heavenly Father hath not planted, shall be rooted up.
- 14 Let them alone: they be blind leaders of the blind. And if the blind lead the blind, both shall fall into the ditch.
- 15 Then answered Peter and said unto him. Declare unto us this parable.

13th, 14th and 15th Amendments to the Constitution of the United States

THE RECONSTRUCTION AMENDMENTS

The 13th, 14th and 15th Amendments to the Constitution are commonly known as the Reconstruction Amendments, inasmuch as they followed the Civil War, and were drafted by Republicans. Mississippi, South Carolina, Georgia, for example—had set up laws which, it was charged, were contrived to perpetuate Negro slavery under other names.

ARTICLE XIII.

.....(Slavery abolished.)

- 1. Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction.
- 2. Congress shall have power by appropriate legislation, to enforce the provisions of this article.

ARTICLE XIV.

(Citizenship Rights Not to Be Abridged.)

1. All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the State wherein they reside. No state shall make or enforce any law which shall abridge the privileges or immunities of citizens of the United States, nor shall any State deprive any person of life, liberty, or property without due process of law, nor deny to any person within the jurisdiction the equal protection of the laws.

ARTICLE XV.

(Equal Rights for White and Colored Citizens.)

The right of the citizens of the United States to vote shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any State on account of race, color, or previous condition of servitude.

.2. The Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.

LINCOLN'S GETTYSBURG ADDRESS

Following is Lincoln's own version revised by him from his own notes, of the address at Gettysburg, Pa., on Nov. 19, 1863. The great battle had been fought on July 1-3, 1863.

Fourscore and seven years ago our fathers brought forth on this continent a new nation conceived in liberty and dedicated to the proposition that all men are created equal.

Now we are engaged in a great civil war, testing whether that nation or any nation so conceived and so dedicated can long endure. We are met on a great battlefield of that war. We have come to dedicate a portion of that field, as a final restingplace of those who here gave their lives that that nation might live. It is altogether fitting and proper that we should do this.

But, in a larger sense, we cannot dedicate—we cannot consecrate—we cannot hallow—this

It is rather for us to be here dedicated to the great task remaining before us-that from these honored dead we take increased devotion to the cause for which they gave the last full measure of devotion—that we here highly resolve that these dead shall not have died in vain—that this nation, under God, shall have a new birth of freedom-and that government of the people, by the people, for the people shall not perish from the earth.


