

#### -0-I AM GOING TO TELL IT JUST LIKE IT WAS

I have seen a great change for the better, since I have been born. I was born in Durhan, North Carolina, January 22, 1898. In a jimcrow state and a jimcrow city. I went to a jimcrow school and a jimcrow college. At the age of twenty-one I was drafted into a jimcrow Army. "World War I." I belonged to a jimcrow church. The dead in my family were buried in a jimcrow graveyard. I rode jimcrow trains and buses. I have been in jimcrow waiting rooms and rest rooms and eating places. My father died in a jimcrow hospital. I asked my uncle to let me make some extra money by helping a certain man plow. This man had two mules, a white mule and a black mule. I had to plow the jimcrow mule. I quit after two days and went home, because he wanted me to call the white mule "Mr. Mule." I know jimcrowism from A to Z. What a change. Things I used to see in the South, I do not see anymore.

I left Baltimore May 10th for Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia and Florida. At every filling station and lunch counter they were nice to me.

There is now a new South.

I left Baltimore April 11th for parts of Maryland, Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Ohio, Indiana and Illinois. Everywhere I go I find that people are kind and courteous.

#### -0-NEAR FIFTY YEARS AGO

About five years before we started the Emmanuel Church of Christ in Baltimore on the first Lord's Day in August 1933. We preached a sermon and the subject was "Openmembership is the main highway to hell, and those who practice openmembership are hell bound travelers.

Our text was Luke 16:23. And in hell he lifted up his eyes. Paul said in Acts 26:21. For these causes the Jews caught me in the temple, and went about to kill me. Having therefore obtained help of God, I continued unto this day, witnessing both to small and great, and Moses did say should come.

Because I preached against openmembership and denominationalism my openmembership Brethren misunderstood me and went about to destroy me.

Having therefore obtained the help of God, Jesus Christ and the Loyal Brethren, I continued unto this day, witnessing both to small and great. Saying none other than those things written in the New Testament and preached by the Apostles, and by those of the Restoration Movement. And by those of the old National Christian Misionary Convention, such men as Preston Taylor, H. L. Herod, W. H. Dickerson, C. H. Dickerson, G. M. Dickerson, C. M. Dickerson, L. L. Dickerson, R. L. I hope one thing you have decided on in 1974 is to be more in touch with the "will of God." How do I do this, you may ask? I read some statistics concerning people's ability to read. Our nation has near twenty million people unable to read. Thirty-six out of every 100 elementary school students who need extra help do not receive it. One out of every four 11-year-old children reads below the level of an average nineyear-old.

Since 1960 this college and her faculty and staff have worked with and enjoyed the fellowship with the Elder W. H. Taylor, and also the members of the Immanuel Church of Christ. We have appreciated their contribution to the betterment of Baltimore and of our nation. Their patriotism is the pattern all should follow. His service to our country in World War I and his honorable discharge preceded his 50 years in pastoring and serving-many times with little remuneration and in difficult circumstances. His present residence has been his home for 40 years. I am certain that no residence in Baltimore has meant more to his country or to his city and that every recognition, reward, and consideration should be given to him and to the Church and the facility which is so vital to their work and the happiness of their lives. We would like for this letter to be made a matter of record and placed in the files of any case or hearing that may involve the Church, their Elder (Dr. Taylor) or their services to the community.

Just as a lack of interest in reading in general leads to illiteracy, the lack of interest in reading God's Word leads to Spiritual decay. Ask yourself, do I really want the will of God for my life? Am I convinced that my life is a life of service? If your answer is yes, your answer demands obedience to His will. To do His will calls you to read the Scriptures. You cannot obey God until you discover what He wants of you.

Some suggested passages to read:

- 1. 1st Thess. 5:16-18. "Rejoice evermore. Pray without ceasing. In everything give thanks; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you."
- 2. Philippians 4:6-7. "Be anxious for nothing." God's way is not the fretting and worrying, scheming and "pulling strings." You will begin to get along fine when you quit trying to help God run His world.
- 3. Isaiah 26:3. "Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is on thee, because he trusteth in thee."
- 4. John 5:39. "Search the Scriptures; for in them ye think ye have eternal life; and they are they which testify of me."



John M. Driver, clergyman, writer and lecturer, stated on the public platform that his hair turned gray in a single night as the result of a domestic tragedy.

James Bridger, American frontiersman noted for his "tall tales," is said to have undergone a similar hair-turning-white-in-one-night experience when hotly pursued by Indians.

There are many other "well authenticated" cases on record in which the hair has turned gray or white in a single day or night as the result of sickness, fear or distress.

# They Have a Word For It

REECE is the foreigner's name for Hellas. J Greeks call themselves Hellenes.

The Greek government is officially known as the Kingdom of Hellas.

The classical culture of Greece as expressed in ancient art and literature is known as Hellenism.

"When Greek meets Greek" suggests the kind of conflict that is likely to result when two men or armed forces of equal courage and strength engage in combat.

The exact quotation is, "When Greeks join Greeks, then was the tug of war."

It is from the fourth act of a tragedy in blank verse entitled "The Rival Queens, or the Death of Alexander the Great," written in 1677 by an English dramatist named Nathaniel Lee.

The line in question refers to the stubborn resistance made by the Greek cities to the Macedonian armies of Philip and his son, Alexander the Great.

The death of King Alexander, who reigned over Greece from 1917 to 1920, was due to the bite of a pet monkey.
