Prospective students will have the opportunity to connect with current students, tour the counseling center and sit in on a counseling class, “Child and Adult Psychopathology,” taught by Dr. Christine Browning, associate professor of counseling and psychology. As a licensed professional counselor, nationally-certified counselor and a psychological examiner, Browning has a passion for working with individuals who have experienced trauma and abuse in childhood and is a certified trauma and abuse counselor.
