COLLEGE BASEBALL**Milligan falls in AAC opener**

Reinhardt University jumped on Milligan College in the first inning and never looked back for a 14-2 victory in the first round of the Appalachian Athletic Conference baseball tournament on Tuesday at Hunter-Wright Stadium in Kingsport.

The Eagles scored three runs in the first and pitcher Josh Wilson held Milligan to two runs on six hits over seven innings. Reinhardt's Phillip Bates had three hits, and Zack Kies drove in three runs on two hits, including a homer. Michael Lomax and Billy King also had two hits and two RBIs apiece.

Milligan starter Jordan Rawlyk was given the loss, after giving up six runs on five hits in two innings. Ryan White hit a two-run homer in the seventh inning for Milligan's only run. White and Kyle Koke both had two hits.

The Buffs fell to 21-28 and will play Tennessee Wesleyan or Bryan in an elimination game today at 5 p.m.

Milligan's Luke Kirk was named the AAC's freshman of the year, the conference announced Tuesday.

David Bergin of Tennessee Wesleyan was the player of the year, while Union's Brandon Hedrick was named the pitcher of the year for second straight season. Union's Bart Osborne was the coach of the year.

Tennessee Wesleyan had six players on the All-AAC team, while Union had five.

Milligan senior Cory Hillen was also an all-conference selection, while junior pitcher Jason Trivett was named to the Gold Glove team.

East Tennessee State's baseball game against UNC-Asheville scheduled for Tuesday night has been moved to Monday, May 9 due to inclement weather in the area. There will be a \$1 business special for fans who show their business card at the rescheduled game. The Bucs play in Boise, N.C., today at 6 p.m. in a non-conference game against former Southern Conference foe Appalachian State.

TENNIS**Wozniacki advances in Madrid**

Top-ranked Caroline Wozniacki advanced to the third round of the Madrid Open by defeating Bojana Jovanovski of Serbia 6-4, 6-1 Tuesday.

Wozniacki broke her opponent twice in the first set and three times in the second, while saving eight of the 11 break points she faced. "Jovanovski is very young and I hadn't played her before," Wozniacki said. "She made some unforced errors, although later in the match she got better and didn't make it easy for me."

Samantha Stosur of Australia also advanced, edging Daria Kasatkina of Slovakia 7-6 (1), 7-5. Stosur also beat Kasatkina in Stuttgart last month.

A man was charged with stalking tennis star Serena Williams after police say they caught him trying to walk into her gated subdivision in South Florida.

Palm Beach Gardens police said 40-year-old Patrenea Ouedraogo told officers he was going to Williams' home Monday night "because he loves her" and "he knows the feelings are reciprocal."

An attorney for Williams said he had recently obtained a restraining order after Ouedraogo tried to contact the player three times.

Subdivision security guards stopped Ouedraogo as he walked in a few minutes after Williams' sister, Venus, returned home, police said. The guards had been told to call police immediately if they saw someone matching Ouedraogo's description.

It was unclear if Ouedraogo has an attorney. He is being held on \$25,000 bond.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL**Goldsmith retires after 45 years**

The last coach to lead Duke to a bowl game is calling it a career after 45 seasons.

Fred Goldsmith announced his retirement Tuesday. He had been coaching at Lenoir-Rhyne for four years, going 17-27 and leading the Division II Bears to a 7-1 record in 2010.

Goldsmith coached at Rice from 1969-83 before beginning a five-year stint with the Blue Devils in 1994. He was the Atlantic Coast Conference's coach of the year that season and took Duke to the Hall of Fame Bowl — one of only two bowl games for the Blue Devils since 1961.

Lenoir-Rhyne president Wayne Powell called Goldsmith "a winner on the field and off."

The school promoted defensive coordinator Mike Houston to acting head coach.

SOCCER**Barcelona in Champions final**

Barcelona advanced to the Champions League final by dominating Real Madrid in a 1-1 tie Tuesday night, winning the semifinal on 3-1 aggregate as Pedro Rodriguez scored off a perfect through pass from Andres Iniesta in the 54th minute.

In the fourth match between the rivals in 18 days, Rodriguez gave Barcelona a three-goal lead in the home-and-home, total-goals series.

Marcelo scored for Real Madrid in 64th minute off a pass from Angel Di Maria, whose initial shot bounced back off a post. Marcelo's was the only shot on goal by the visitors in the entire match.

Seeing its fourth Champions League title and third in six years, Barcelona plays Manchester United or Schalke on May 28 at Wembley. Manchester United takes a 2-0 lead into Wednesday night's second leg at Old Trafford, and the final could be a rematch of the 2009 championship that Barcelona won 2-0.
