BRIEFLY**COLLEGE ATHLETICS****ETSU wins all-sports trophy**

With six top-five finishes in the Atlantic Sun Conference spring championship season, East Tennessee State clinched its fifth consecutive Bill Bibb Trophy, the league's all-sports award.

The Bucs earned conference titles in men's and women's tennis, and finished in the top five in golf and track & field to push their points total to 238½. North Florida is second in the race with 285 points, leading Kennesaw State (271 1/2), Campbell (258) and Jacksonville (226 1/2) with the softball and baseball championships remaining.

ETSU also sealed the men's all-sports race for the Jesse C. Fletcher trophy amassing 169½ points and two conference titles. The Bucs have won the trophy every year since joining the league in 2008, surpassing Georgia Southern for the longest streak in league history. The six trophies ties ETSU with Central Florida for second most all-time and puts them one behind Georgia Southern for the league record. Campbell, Kennesaw State and North Florida are in line for runner-up with the baseball left to finish.

On the women's side, Jacksonville secured the Sherman Day Trophy with two conference championships in track & field for 163 points. ETSU's women are second with 162 points, while North Florida is third with 169½ points.

COLLEGE BASEBALL**Bucs add Clemson to schedule**

East Tennessee State added a May 11 non-conference baseball game against No. 23 Clemson to its schedule on Monday.

First pitch will be at 6:30 p.m. at Doug Kingsmore Stadium in Clemson, S.C. and admission is free.

ETSU is also set to face Eastern Kentucky in a two-game, non-conference series starting today at 4 p.m. at Turley Hughes Field in Richmond, Va. The Bucs and Colonels close out the series on Wednesday at 2 p.m.

The Bucs stand at 23-15 and 12-10 in the Atlantic Sun after ending a six-game skid on Saturday with a 7-3 win over Kennesaw State in the series finale. Eastern Kentucky leads the all-time series with ETSU 49-31. The Colonels took both games of a mid-week series at Cardinal Park last year.

Milligan's rally fall shorts

Milligan College's baseball team came up short 6-4 against Appalachian Athletic Conference foe Union College on Monday.

Trailing 5-1, the Buffs plated three runs in the seventh to pull within a run but could get no closer. Luke Kirk drove in a pair of runs on two hits, and Dustin Ford had two hits and scored a run for Milligan. Corey Hilton also drove in a run.

Sean Robinson allowed five runs, on five hits with five strikeouts over six innings in the loss. Milligan fell to 21-27 and 10-11 in the AAC. The Buffs play a doubleheader at King College on Thursday at 2 p.m.

COLLEGE FOOTBALL**Nebraska extends Pelini's deal**

Nebraska athletic director Tom Osborne says he's giving coach Bo Pelini a new five-year contract to ward off teams that might want to hire him away from the Cornhuskers. Pelini's contract gives him an immediate \$425,000 raise, to \$2.75 million, and will pay him more than \$3 million a year starting in 2014.

Pelini's name in December was linked to the opening at Miami in media reports. Osborne said Monday that "two or three" schools were interested in Pelini after last season, but he wouldn't name them.

■ The NCAA has cleared Barry Brunetti to play football immediately at Mississippi, giving the Rebels three scholarship quarterbacks for the upcoming season.

Brunetti, a transfer from West Virginia who is from Memphis, came to Ole Miss in part because of his ailing mother. The NCAA usually requires transfers to sit out one season but can grant a waiver if there is a family hardship. Ole Miss is about 75 miles from Memphis.

COLLEGE BASKETBALL**George Washington fires coach**

Karl Hobbs was fired Monday as men's basketball coach at George Washington after 10 seasons at the school.

A person familiar with the situation who spoke to The Associated Press on condition of anonymity said that Hobbs was offered the chance to resign but refused to do so.

Hobbs' firing comes less than a week after Patrick Nera was introduced as George Washington's new athletic director. Jack Kvanaz is stepping down from that position during the summer.

■ Temple assistant Matt Langel is the new coach of the Colgate Raiders.

Langel succeeds Emmett Davis, who was released from his contract in mid-March after finishing the season 7-23 overall and 4-10 in the Patriot League.

■ Florida coach Billy Donovan has filled his final staff vacancy by hiring former assistant Matt McCall.

McCall returns to Florida after three seasons as an assistant coach at Florida Atlantic.

GOLF**Palmer to play at Quail Hollow**

Arnold Palmer will play in the Wells Fargo Championship pro-am in Charlotte, N.C., on May 4 and be paired with his grandson.

The tournament announced Monday that Palmer will play with Sam Saunders, who is getting a sponsor exemption to play in the PGA Tour event at Quail Hollow. Club president Johnny Harris will complete the threesome.

The 81-year-old Palmer won 62 times on the PGA Tour, including seven major championships. He helped oversee the modification of several holes at Quail Hollow in 1986.

Palmer last played a public round in Charlotte when he competed in a Champions Tour event in 2001.
