■ Daniel Norris (4-1) threw a no-hitter in the Kessler Classic in Knoxville as Science Hill defeated Corryton Gibbs 10-0 on Saturday. Norris struck out 12 and the only baserunner came on an error. Heath Loyd (2 for 3), Will Carter (grand slam), Jackson Reid (2 for 3, RBI) and Kyle Wilson (2 for 3, RBI) were the top hitters.

Loyd went 3 for 4 with an RBI to lead the Hilltoppers (17-7) in a 5-4 win over Knox Bearden on Saturday in the Kessler Classic.

Norris was 2 for 4 with an RBI and a double. Matt Pope (1-0) got the win on the mound with 2-1/3 hitless innings.

ETSU to host Virginia Tech

East Tennessee State will play host to Virginia Tech today in a non-conference baseball game at Cardinal Park. All current and former service men and women will be admitted for \$1 as part of American Heroes Day. First pitch is 7:15 p.m.

The Bucs (22-12, 11-8 A-Sun) are looking to end a three-game slide after being swept for the first time this year by Belmont. The three-game losing streak is the longest of the season for ETSU. Senior Derek Trent leads ETSU's offense, batting .354 with seven homers and 37 RBIs.

The Hokies (19-19, 4-14 ACC) lead the all-time series with ETSU at 31-17. Virginia Tech has won two of its last five games, including a 1-2 series against Florida State in Blacksburg, Va.

Bucs seventh at A-Sun

East Tennessee State freshman Spencer Lawson fired a team-low 1-under 70 Monday to lead the Bucs on the opening day of the Atlantic Sun Championship played on the Chateau Course at Chateau Elan in Braselton, Ga.

Lawson, who is tied for eighth place, was one of just 11 players to shoot an under-par round on Monday. ETSU is in seventh after an opening day 9-over 293. Host Kennesaw State leads the way with a 4-under 280, while USC Upstate, UNF, and Campbell are all tied for second at 1-over 285. Florida Gulf Coast (286) is fifth, followed by Belmont (291) and defending champion Bucs.

Matthew Hopper of USC Upstate shot a five-under-par 66 to stand atop the leaderboard. Jeff Karlsson of Kennesaw State is second at four-under 67, one stroke ahead of teammate Matt Nagy (68).

ETSU junior Devin Konline is tied for 13th at 1-over 72. Sophomore Patrick Spraggs shot an opening round 75 and is tied for 35th, while freshman Lucas Armstrong sits one behind in 39th at 76. Senior Paul O'Kane rounded out ETSU's scoring with a 77.

The second round will be played today and the final on Wednesday.

Buffs sweep North Greenville

Milligan College's softball team picked up a pair of wins on Monday at Anglin Field against NCAA Division 2 opponent North Greenville.

The Lady Buffs won the first game 1-0 and held on for a 5-4 victory in the second.

Sidney Burns allowed just four hits and struck out five for the shutout in game one. The lone run of the game came in the eighth, when Emily Biggs singled in Camille Olvey.
