Beyond the classroom sessions and practical experience, Aubrey also made important frends, two of whom will join bet band.
Aubrey has prepared the first five sough for her next album and is anxious to get back in the studio.
"When you write a song, it's like a skeleton. But in the studio you kind of put flesh on it," said Aubrey. 'It's hard work... I'm a perfectionist and everyone in the studio is a perfectionist."
