We, the Senior class of 1957, with love and esteem, take great pride in dedicating this edition of the BUFFALO to Mr. Robert O. Fife.


In the few short years that he has been at Milligan he has graciously lent his talents to many fields. He has been teacher and minister to many of the Milligan family and a friend to each of us.
