






Madrigal Dinner
















To say that the baseball team tried hard would be an understatement. The word athlete is hard to define, but the athletes on the baseball squad put forth everything they had and came out of the season a great team.

As President of the College, Dr. Johnson is concerned with Milligan's development in three areas: spiritual, academic, and social.

Milligan is trying to evidence an element of a deep commitment to Christ. Dr. Johnson feels that our lives should be the evidence of this commitment. "The quality of thought, word, and deed should be conclusive evidence of a Christian life."

"If we are committed Christians, the academic quality ought to be the highest possible." Dr. Johnson realizes that this would be an ideal situation, but it is that for which we must strive. "People committed to this high quest of learning, committed to the point of being dedicated and diligent" in sharing the responsibility of this quest are the kind of people Milligan should attract. Faculty and students must establish a good "rapport," and work together as friends.

Milligan tries to provide a "full, rich, and satisfying life" for the members of its family. Dr. Johnson feels that we must establish a "fellowship" which gives a "sense of sharing lives in a mutual adventure of Christian learning in a liberal arts context."
