

Milligan College Pre-Med Club

ligan College has emerged as a faculty. leader in the field of pre medical courses. The college offers preparatory courses for students aspiring to be physicians and thus far has established a splended record Not a single graduate of the college entering the University Medical Schools has failed or dropped the course. Only four institutions in the South have maintained such a record. The college has sent nine students to the school of medicine at the University of Vanderbilt on the Commonwealth Fund scholarship. The scholarships were won on the competitive basis. After their records were measured with the students from other under graduate schoois over the area of Tennessee.

At the beginning of the year the track team had only two experien ed boys to report Floyd Childers and "Jo-Jo" Dellinger. New members reporting were Frank Spraker, Charlie D'Agata, Ralph Morrell, David Trotter, Walt Dorricott, Jack Ankeny, Jack Cregger, Hugh Blessing, Kenneth Kennedy, Bob Easterling and Alvin Williams.

The team was off with a good start, defeating Concord College, Athens, West Virginia, April 12. In this meet D'Agata scored 24 points. He took first place with the javelin, 100 yard dash, and the 220 dash. Dellinger scored 10 points, Childers I5 points. The final score was 68 % for Milligan and 57 1/3 for Concord.

On April 19 the Milligan team met at L. M. U. This time Milligan won 80 - 50. D'Agata scored 28 points; Childers 24 points; Dellinger, 13 points. These were the hight point men.

Our next meet was with Emory and Henry on April 27. Emory defeated Milliagn 721/2 to 531/2. D'Agata again scored 25 points for high point man in the meet.

On April 30 Milligan defeated Bluefield 74½-36½. This time D'Agata kept his usual 25 point record. Childers scored 13 points and Dellinger scored 10 points.

The following boys are showing good possibilities of being good track stars next year: Kenneth Kennedy Easterling, Morrell, Trotter, Cregger, Ankeny, and Blessing.
