

#### I CAN'T FIND ANY

As a reporter for the Christian Informer, with a keen detective eye; for wrong treatment by the Brethren. I have for the past twelve months been looking for "racial hatred, segregation, jim-crowism and discrimination, or any other mistreatment by the brethren of the Church of Christ or Christian Church.

To my happy surprise, I can't find any. It does not exist among my brethren whom I have been in contact.

I have looked in such places as the gathering of the forty-four thousand Christians, at the North American Christian Convention, in St. Louis, Mo., in 1970.

I looked for it in the hotel, dining room and other places I ate; but I found none. I found none in the Convention Hall.. I looked for it among the Presidents, Faculty and Student body at Eastern Christian College, Bel Air, Md., but I found none. I looked for it among the President, and Faculty and Student body at Winston Salem Bible College, Winston Salem, N.C., but I found none. I looked for it among the President, Faculty and Student body at the College of the Scriptures, Louisville, Ky., but I found none.

I found none among the churches I have visited and preached, nor among the meetings I have attended; nor in the homes or places I have eaten with my brethren and their families. I did not find it at the Fellowship Revival held at Emmanuel Church of Christ recently in Baltimore. I did not find it at the funeral of one of our beloved brethren. As Pilate said in John 19:4, I find no fault in him. I find no fault in the brethren. Concerning racial hatred or segregation, I found nothing to write about. As Festus said to King Agrippa, in Acts 25:26-27, Of whom I have no certain thing to write unto my Lord. For it seemeth to me unreasonable to send a prisoner, and not withal to signify the crimes laid against him.

Old Timers will recall, we wrote an editorial in the Christian Informer about twenty-five years ago, stating that open-membership, segregation, jim-crowism, were "HEADED FOR THE LAST ROUND UP." I believed it then and I believe it now. That Christ is the answer.

### GIVE CHRIST THE GLORY AND HONOR

Never say church, without, saying Church of Christ or Christian Church. Romans 16:16; Acts 11:26. God hath given him a name above every name. Philippians 2:9-10-11.

You can be sure, if it is the Church of Christ. Because Christ said in Matthew 16:18, I will build my church. Except the Lord build the house, they labour in vain that build it. Psalm 127:1. The apostles knew only one church and one name.

### ALEXANDER CAMPBELL

I believe some open membership brethren and some late model preachers are twisting some of the things Alexander Campbell said. I love Alexander Campbell, but I am only interested in what Christ and the Apostles said and wrote. The denominational gates are the only gates I know of that are trying to prevail against the Church of Christ. Christ said in Matthew 15:9.

But in vain they do worship me, teaching for doctrines the commandments of men. He that hath my commandments, and keepeth them, he it is that loveth me: and he that loveth me shall be loved by my Father, and I will love, and will manifest myself to him. John 14:21.

Anderson; Caroline St., again under the leadership of Elder J. W. Franklin; McMechen St., Laurence St., Harlem Ave., Franklin St., Lexington St., Gold St., under the leadership of Elder J. W. Robinson, Elder J. W. Simms and Sister Minnie Queen; East Lexington St., under the leadership of Elder A. E. Osborn; Robert St. and Myrtle Ave., under the leadership of Elder S. H. Smith.

All of these Missions died. Why they died? Your answer is as good as mine, say it. I can say that "They died in the faith." They did not die robing Peter to pay Paul. They did not die trying to confuse, innocent and satisfied members of Emmanuel Church of Christ.

#### WHAT IS OUR DOCTRINAL POSITION

Perhaps a statement of our doctrinal position might help you to decide in favor of the Winston-Salem Bible College.

The Winston-Salem Bible College is an institution in which men and women may receive adequate and thorough traning for Christian leadership. The Bible is its chief text book. The college endeavors to arrange all of its courses of study and conduct its work in harmony with the spirit and the letter of the Word of God.

- 1. Every director and faculty member of WSBC belongs to the Church of Christ or Christian Church and is loyal to the historic position of the plea to restore primitive Christianity. Nearly every man on the board of directors is either an elder of outstanding ability and consecration or a minister of the Church of Christ. All male members of the faculty are ministers of the gospel.
- 2. We believe and teach that the Bible is the Word of God and contains the revelation of His divine plan of redemption.
- 3. We believe and teach that Jesus is "the Christ, the Son of the living God" and that in Him we find "the way, the Truth, and the Life" that leads to God the Father.
- 4. We believe and teach the gospel facts: that "Christ died for our sins according to the scriptures, and that He was buried, and that He hath been raised on the third day according to the scriptures."
- 5. We believe and teach that the revealed plan of salvation necessitates faith, repentance, confession, baptism, and faithful Christian living on our part.
- 6. We believe and teach that the saved constitute the church, the body of Christ, in this present age, and that this body must be pure, chaste, spirit-guided, and evangelistic.
- 7. We believe and teach the necessity of Christian unity as a measure of loyalty to the authority of Christ. We believe that such unity can only be achieved by adherence to the Holy Spirit given Word of God without human additions, subtractions, or substitutions.
- 8. We believe and teach that the Lord Jesus Christ will consummate the age with His appearing to claim His own and to pronounce judgment upon the disobedient.
- 9. We believe and teach that "God was in Christ reconciling the world unto Himself," and He has "committed unto us the word of

### The First Lord's Day In August 1933

Was the birthday of Emmanuel Church of Christ in Baltimore, Md.

Before starting Emmanuel, we were the pastor of Mt. Olivet Christian Church in Baltimore for eight years. In those days open membership was the battle ground between the late Dr. Peter Anslie and W. H. (Baltimore) Taylor, then pastor of Mt. Olivet. During that eight year war on open membership; Baltimore Taylor shot a cannon into the open membership camp; in the form of a sermon. His subject was: "Open membership is the main highway to hell, and those who practice open membership are hell bound travelers." The open membership camp got busy, they brought out their heavy artillery. They said to Taylor, "Christian Temple Church holds the deed to the Mt. Olivet Church property and you will have to stop preaching against open membership or get out."

Old Taylor got out at once and gave birth to the Emmanual congregation. We will preach against denominationalism and open membership until, "Every foe is vanquished and Christ is Lord indeed."



### From Seven to Seventy-Two

On Easter we baptized nine souls into Christ. At Emmanuel Church of Christ, Baltimore, Maryland in age from seven to seventy-two. A mother and three of her children were buried with Christ in baptism. Twenty-four members have been added to the church this year.

History of the College of Eastern Christian College, Dr. J. T. Segroves, President



In 1945 church rallies in Eastern Pennsylvania and in East Orange, New Jersey passed resolutions recommending the formation of a founding committee which first met in March 1946. Eastern Christian Institute formally opened in September 1946 in the quarters of the Central Christian Church in East Orange, New Jersey. M. S. Kitchen was the first president.

The College was hampered by zoning restrictions and heavy financial requirements for accreditation in New Jersey. These and other factors necessitated a relocation, and in October, 1958, property was purchased in Maryland.

Eastern Christian College was incorporated on May 1, 1959, at Bel Air, Maryland with Rolland Steever as acting president. Extensive repairs and numerous improvements on the property were conducted under his leadership. In September, 1960, J. Thomas Segroves accepted the invitation of the trustees to become president of the College. The College has been reorganized with an enlarged Board of Trustees, Corporate Directors, Advisory Council, College Administration, Faculty and Staff. Eastern Christian College is a nonprofit Christian co-educational institution under the oversight of a self-perpetuating Board of Trustees.

The College opened in September of 1961 with a full four-year program and a faculty of nine. Many improvements in the physical property, both buildings and grounds, and in the program of the College have been made and will continue to be made as time goes on.

The College is a "work of faith" depending on the support of those who beleve in its cause. It is a pioneer effort in the sense that there are few preachers and few strong supporting churches in the area. The proportion of preachers per capita is less than on several of our foreign missionary fields. Almost one-third of the population of the U.S. is closer to Eastern Christian College than to any of our other Bible Colleges.

In the analogy of Mark Hopkins, the teacher and the student are the prime essentials to edu-
