Milligan College announces several staff changes taking place this summer in its office of institutional advancement.

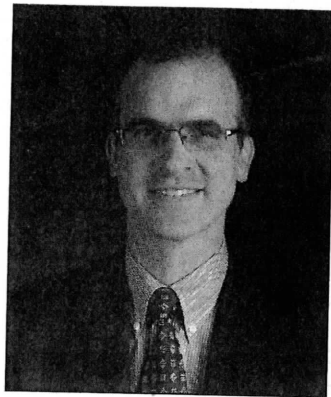

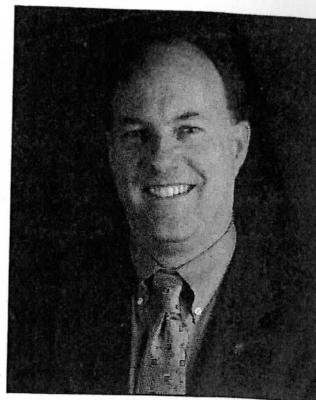
