Milligan played league-leading Union tough on Saturday in Barbourville, Ky.

Nevertheless, the Bufs dropped a pair to the Bulldogs, losing 6-4 and 5-1.

Slipping to 10-10 in the Appalachian Athletic Conference, Milligan now stands at 21-26 overall.

Milligan had the early lead in Game 1 with three runs in the top of the first inning, but Union was out in front (4-3) by the end of the third.

The Bufs' Dustin Ford was 3-for-4 and Tyler Hutson 2-for-4. Corey Hilton went 1-for-2.

Luke Kirk topped Milligan in the second game by going 2-for-2. Ryan White was 2-for-3.

The Bufs and Buffaloes meet again Monday on Union's field. First pitch is slated for 3 p.m.

**WOMEN'S COLLEGE TENNIS****Lady Bufs beaten by Brenau**

Milligan was no match for nationally ranked Brenau University on Saturday afternoon in Gainesville, Ga.

Despite a hard fought effort, the Buffaloes fell 9-0 to the seventh-ranked Golden Tigers.

Freshman Alyssa Hoff fell in a super tie-breaker to Nelli Martinyova (6-7, 7-5, 10-8), and Albany Kelly fell 6-1, 6-3 to Kate Mizeckova.

"It was great for our girls to see the toughest level of NATA tennis as we are heading into postseason play," Milligan coach Ryan Reynolds said. "It is always to play this level of opponent heading into the tournament."

The Appalachian Athletic Conference champion Lady Bufs ended the regular season with a 12-6 mark. Both Milligan squads return to action on Friday when they participate in the NATA Qualifier in Chattanooga.

**COLLEGE FOOTBALL****Miles' sister killed in crash**

The sister of LSU head football coach Les Miles has died in a car accident near Baton Rouge.

Atlas Assistant Police Chief David Jones said 54-year-old Ann Hope Browne, of Zachary, was attempting to merge onto Louisiana Highway 1 on Friday when her car was struck in the driver's side by a pickup truck.

West Baton Rouge Parish coroner's investigator Yancy Guerin said Browne was pronounced dead at the scene. Police said two adults and four children in the truck escaped injury.

Sports information director Michael Bonnette said the university is declining to comment.
