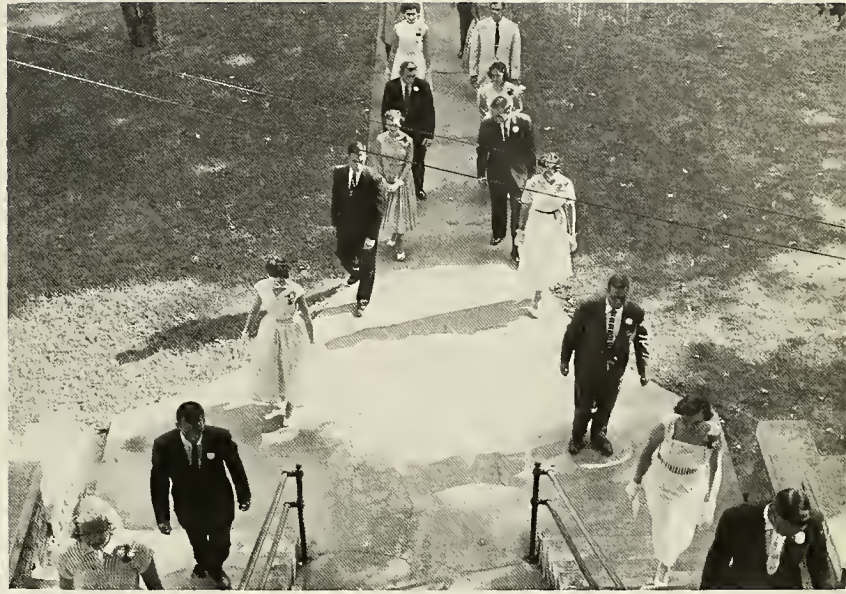
Overture to Milligan

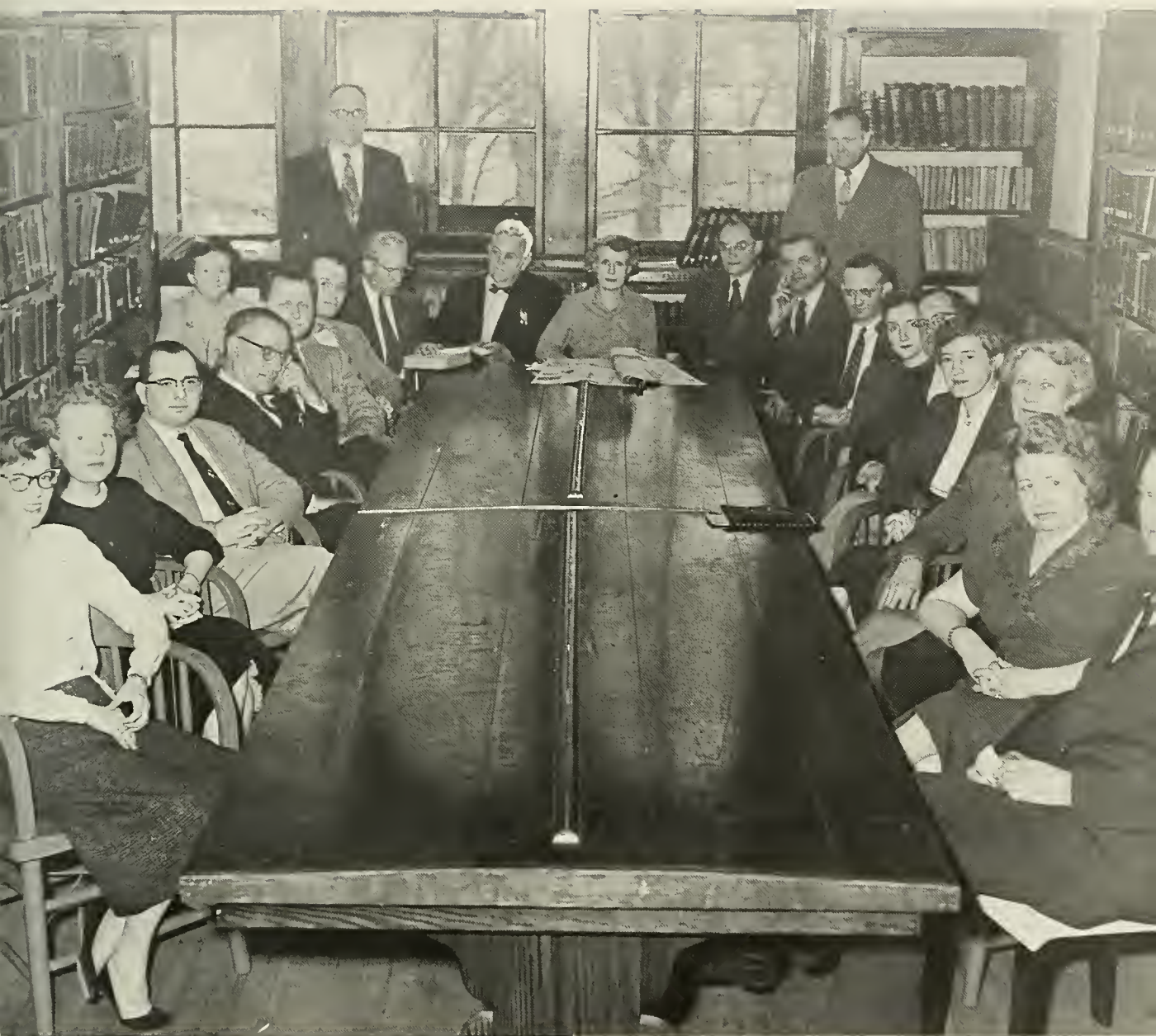




DEDICATION

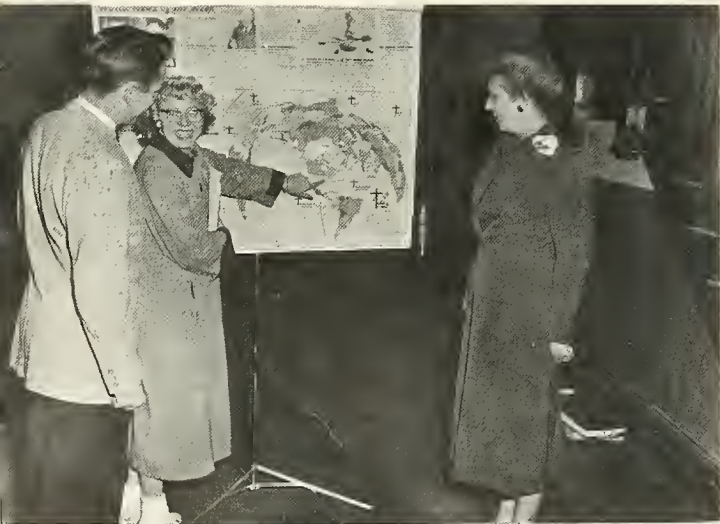
SOCIAL SCIENCE CLUB

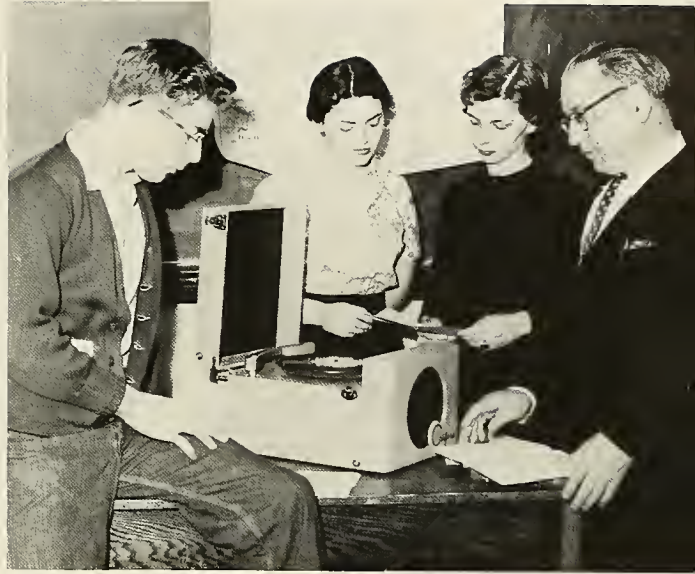


FRENCH CLUB

BASKETBALL

Not enough praise can go to Coach Duard Walker for the success of the 1955-56 Milligan College basketball team. The Buffaloes won eleven and lost eleven — playing some of the top small college teams in this section of the country. Coach Walker patiently worked with and led the boys in a way that could not be surpassed.
