Text: Rev. 1:18

"I am he that liveth and was dead, and behold, I am alive forever more, amen: and have the keys of Hell, and of Death."

Proof of Christ's Resurrection

Witnesses

First-Angels. Proof: On the morning of the resurrection. The women were first at the Tomb, and they saw the Angel of the Lord who had descended from heaven, rolled away the stone and sat upon it.-Matt. 28:2-6. The Angel said He is not here; He is risen as He said. Come see the place where the Lord lay.

Second witnesses: The women. Mark, 16th chapter, tells us of the women being at the Sepulchre early in the morning and seeing the angel and Mary Magdalene (verse 9) saw Him and started to touch Him.

Third: The two of Christ's disciples. Luke, 24th chapter, read it.

Fourth: The Twelve. Proof: I Cor. 15:5. He was seen of Cephas, then of the Twelve.

Fifth: About five hundred. Read verse 6. After that He was seen of above five hundred brethren at once

Sixth: He was seen of Paul. Proof: I Cor. 15-8. And last of all He was seen of me also, as of one born out of dire time.

The children go to Sunday School, The grown-ups keep the Golden Rule; It's funny just to see the manner All of them rival for the Banner.


Those ole Virginia hills ain't tall But round on top as any ball; They're not very hard to climb, The valleys join them in their rhyme,

THE IDENTITY OF THE CHURCH

So the church through out all Judea and Galilee and Samaria had peace, being edified; and walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, was multiplied. Acts 9:31.

We note our basic text does not tell of the churches in these sections but the church. When we think of the church of Jesus Christ, it has but one faith, one system of doctrine. by which to be guided into all matters of belief and practice. Since the Apostles were all guided by the same spirit, they all preached the same gospel. Therefor, the churches they established all over the world were alike. They wore the same name, they had the same organization; they required obedience to the same commandments for entrance into their fellowship; they observed the same items of worship and carried on the same work. And as long as they followed the teaching of Christ and the Apostles, they continued to be alike. The same is true today with us. We are alike so long as we continue to practice and teach the things that can be found in the book of inspiration. Only the traditions of men can change a Bible centered church. The early churches were so much alike that it was said that the congregations throughout Judea and Galilee and Samaria were one church; for it is said that the church singular in all that area was multiplied. This was done because they all walked in the fear of the Lord and the guidance of the Holy Spirit. If all preachers and teachers will imitate Paul in the things they teach and preach, deship because it has laid down the God given guide which is the Bible, for the worship books written by men who are not even in harmony with the Spirit of Christ. God is a Spirit and they that worship Him must worship Him in truth; not out of a hand book. You can't get the spirit out of a thing that the spirit is not in. John 6:63b says: The

heard and received and saw in me, these things do: and the God of peace will be with you. Phil. 4:9. Paul expected all of the churches to practice the same thing which he organized, because he taught them the same thing. Why do we have ministers who will teach one thing in one place and another thing in another place? Even the demands for this type of preaching does not reveal an identical church.

There are people today who have never seen the church and I am sure they would like to see it. Well here is a good way to find it: Look for the church just like you would look for a man you had never seen. Get his name, height, age, color and occupation, etc., then you would measure every man you saw until you found the one that filled the description. You might find one with the right name but when you check up on him he does not have the right age. So it is with the church; there are many churches today who have the name but not the age, therefor could not be the church we are talking about in the Bible. If your form started since Pentecost, it started too late; and if it started before Pentecost, it started too soon. Would you conclude that you had found your man just because he had one mark of identity? We find a number of groups with one mark, but that is not enough. In looking for the church of our Lord Jesus today we must find a church wearing the right name; one that began at the right place; one with the right entrance requirements; the right organization, and the right work and worship. Even though the name is not the sole mark of identity, yet if a church does not wear the name today it is not the right one. In order for people to become members of the Lord's church they had to believe the gospel, repent of their sins, confess Jesus Christ and be baptized into the name of Christ Jesus for the remission of their sins. Mark 16:15-16; Romans 10:9-10, and Acts 2:38. Any church requiring more than the Bible requires or less than it requires, can not be the church we read about in the Bible. It might have the right name but if it does not require persons to do as the Bible so commands, they are not Christians, for people must do the things written in order to become a Christian. The worship of the early church was very plain and simple. They sang Psalms, hymns and spiritual songs, prayed, took the Lord's supper on the first day of the week, gave of their money for the purpose of the gospel, and taught for mutual edification. They did charity and benevolent work and made gifts for same but they had a thorough knowledge of what they were giving the money for. As few and as simple as these items are, they complete the list of things authorized by the teaching and examples of the Apostles. If a church does less than these, it is not the church we are looking for. The early church had for its work the preaching of the gospel to every creature, a program of teaching within the church, and the relief of the needy, especially those of the household of faith. James nominational differences will vanish. The church today has 1:27, Gal. 6:10. Elaborate organizations such as we find in left the old land mark in its doctrine, fellowship and wor- our churches today were unknown in the early church, and is not needed now to carry on the work and worship of a true church. The true Christian or church of Christ today will meet these requirements and bear these marks of identity, it cannot be denied. We have some churches with the voice of Jacob but the hands of Esau. But we are looking for the true church in our day. If we have been playing words which I speak unto you they are spirit and they are church let us stop today and see if we can't reveal the life. 
