#### Moore leads A-A team again

Make it a perfect 4 for 4 for Maya Moore. The Connecticut star became only the second four-time All-American when she was honored by The Associated Press on Tuesday. She was joined on the team by Baylor's Brittney Griner, Stanford's Jeanette Pohlen, Texas A&M's Danielle Adams and Ohio State's Jantel Lavender.

"It's really special and something that I'm sure I will really appreciate more when I look back on it years from now," said Moore, who along with former Oklahoma star Courtney Paris are the only four-time recipients. "I've been blessed to have had really good teammates to play with over my career."

Although Moore played down the achievement, her coach Geno Auriemma had plenty of praise for his star.

"You take the points she's scored, rebounds, steals, you add it all up, you would be hard pressed to find somebody who's had a better career than that of Connecticut or anywhere else for that matter," Auriemma said.

Moore received 195 points and was a unanimous choice by the 39-member national media panel that votes in the weekly Top 25. Voting was done before the NCAA tournament.

It's the third straight year that Moore was a unanimous choice.

### COLLEGE TENNIS

#### ETSU gets crucial A-Sun win

East Tennessee State's men's tennis team defeated Campbell 5-2 on Tuesday in Boies Creek, N.C., to move into a tie atop the Atlantic Sun Conference standings.

The Bucs, who have won four straight matches and their last six in the A-Sun, moved to 13-6 and 7-1 in the league and are tied with North Florida. The win put ETSU a game ahead of Campbell.

"The guys need to be reminded daily that no one is going to fold over and just let us win," said ETSU coach Yaser Zantini. "Even though we look strong on paper, the tennis ball bounces and we still need to hit it back. It is not like teams assume that we are going to win and our guys need to realize that."

Campbell clinched the doubles point with victories at the No. 1 and 3 spots. ETSU's Sander Gille and Jesus Bandres won their ninth straight doubles match.

Bandres, who leads the Bucs with 11 singles wins, evened the match with a 6-1, 6-3 win over Campbell's Fernando Guillen. Gille and Roger Ordeig both won their singles matches to put ETSU up 3-1, before Campbell's Davy Sum defeated Grega Teraz to keep the Camels alive. ETSU clinched the match as Juan Ramirez defeated David Clavera, 7-6, 7-5 in the No. 5 position.

ETSU has two more regular-season, A-Sun matches, facing Kennesaw State on Friday and Mercer on Saturday. Both matches are on the road.

#### Lady Bucs play host to App State

East Tennessee State's softball team will play host to Appalachian State in a non-conference doubleheader today at Betty Basler Field. First pitch is 5 p.m.

Fans wearing pink will be admitted for \$1 as part of the National Fastpitch Coaches Association's StrikeOut Cancer program.

The Lady Bucs evened their Atlantic Sun Conference record at 2-2 after sweeping Belmont on Saturday. Arlelle Garner and Jackie Blair led ETSU at the plate against Belmont and both average over .300 this season. ETSU ranks second in the A-Sun with a .288 average.

The Mountaineers were swept by Chattanooga over the weekend and enter today's doubleheader with an 11-16 record.

#### Milligan swept by Lee

Milligan College's baseball team dropped a pair of games to nationally-ranked Lee University on Tuesday at Anglin Field. The Buffs lost 2-1 and 7-4.

The Flames, ranked second in the nation, plated two runs in the top of the first in the opener. Milligan's only run came in the fourth as Kyle Kolat drove in Dustin Ford. Kolat went 3-for-3 with an RBI on the day. Jordan Rawlyk suffered the loss, giving up two runs on four hits in three innings.

In the second game, Lee again put two runs on the board in the first, then added one more in both the third and fourth.

Milligan rallied to tie it up on a sacrifice fly in the fifth by Ford that scored Cody Hyder. The Buffs also got a solo home run from Luke Kirk in the first, while Kolat and Ford both scored a run apiece in the fourth. Lee broke the tie in the seventh and kept Milligan's bats quiet the rest of the way.

Ford and Kolat both had two hits. JJ Bergamin was handed the loss after two innings of relief. Ethan Heenor got the start, allowing four runs on six hits in three innings.

Milligan moved to 16-17 overall and will play an Appalachian Athletic Conference doubleheader at Montreat on Saturday starting at 1 p.m.

### NBA

#### Rose faces drunk driving charges

Former NBA and Fab Five standout Jalen Rose was arrested earlier this month on suspicion of drunken driving.

West Bloomfield Township Police, Mich., Lt. Tim Diamond said Tuesday that Rose was arrested around 2 a.m. March 11. He's accused of operating a vehicle while impaired.

A representative for Rose didn't immediately return a call by The Associated Press seeking comment.

The 38-year-old Rose played 13 years in the NBA, reaching the finals with Indiana in 2000. He was also part of Michigan's famous Fab Five, which reached the NCAA title game in 1992 and 1993.

Rose was part of a recent ESPN documentary on the Fab Five.
